Travis Roy was a freshman forward on the Boston University men's hockey team, when, eleven seconds into his first shift for the Terriers, he crashed headfirst into the boards, shattering his fourth and fifth cervical vertebrae. His foundation, established in 1996, has helped more than 2,100 quadriplegics and paraplegics, and has awarded more than \$5 million in grants toward spinal cord research. Travis died on October 15, 2020, almost 25-years after his injury.

"The compassion and courage demonstrated time and again by these many caregivers let us all know that our efforts were based on love. Love was absolutely what got us all through those times of doubt and uncertainty. The long days and nights with little or no sleep, the trips to the dreaded ER and witnessing the pain that our loved ones were going through. All these emotions and more were so much a part of our lives and you have brought this out in *The Greatest Burden The Greatest Blessing*. I don't think any of us realized that we were not alone during those tough times. Others were going through even tougher times, and we didn't know it or couldn't imagine it could be worse."

In her heartfelt Foreword, Rashida Ali Walsh, daughter of legendary boxer Muhammad Ali, wrote, "Sometimes it's the care recipient, and sometimes it's the care partner, but the amount of courage, compassion, hope, humility, kindness, and love demonstrated throughout the book is, quite simply, the greatest."
